

The 406 Table

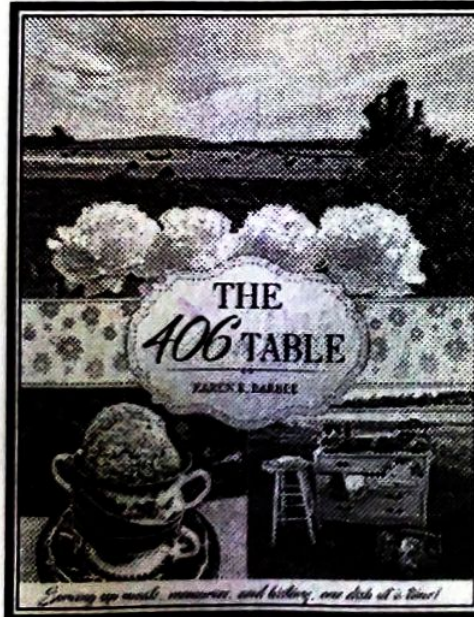

The book is a tribute to Montana which includes charming stories of her growing up on a wheat and barley farm outside of the "Birthplace of Montana." The story of 'Steer Montana' the record setting steer, who resides in the O'Fallon Museum, makes the book with a recipe, that pays tribute to the famous steer. There are over 280 photos, of which most of them were taken by Barbee, followed by Montana history and over 120 recipes, which are country/comfort
